

The Langdale Boulders

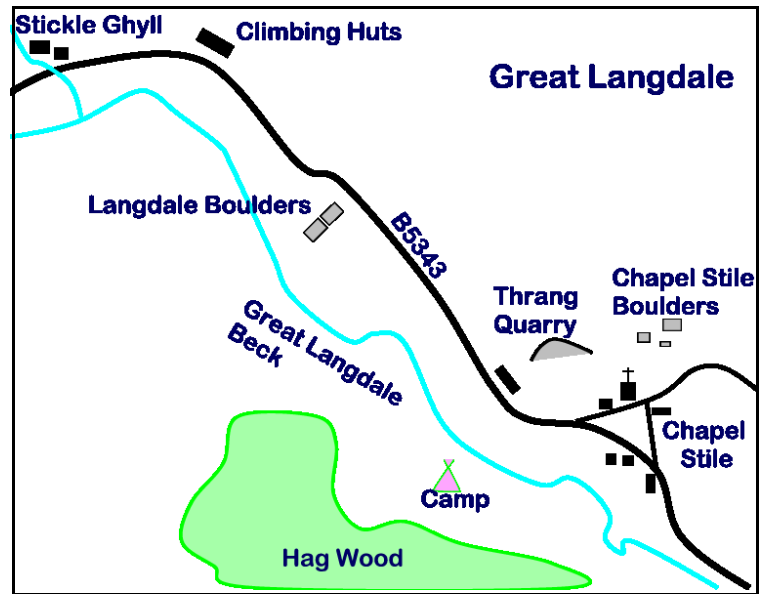
Problem descriptions and selection based on information published in the Lakes Rockfax guidebook <ROCKFAX 1994>

Approach. Grid Reference 314058

Enter Langdale, and follow the valley road (B5343) to Chapel Stile. The boulders are a further 1km and are easy to spot in a field left of the road (through a gate), park in the lay-bys on the right. If you reach the climbing huts you've gone too far.

Access.

Although the boulders are in a farmers field climbing is permitted, although no dogs please. Both boulders are next to each other and connected via a wall and stile.



1. VO - Pleasant crack.
2. VO - Wall.
3. V2 - The short arête.
4. V3 - Low level traverse.
5. VO - The simple wall.
6. V1 - Slab sans break.
7. VO - Left crack sans break.
8. VO - Slab sans break.
9. V4 - Arête moving left.
10. V5 - Wall using the pocket. *
11. V6/7 - Wall via a thin crack. *
12. V6 - Wall via sharp edge.
13. V1 - The classic crack is very good. *
14. V5 - Wall via undercut, sans crack. *
15. V7 - Traverse the low break, tricky.
16. V9 **Stefan Grossman** - The superb hang hanging arête. (V11 from sitting to the right)**
17. VO - Another easy wall.
18. V1 - Arête.
19. V2 - Wall without the bigger holds.
20. VO - Another Wall.
21. VO - Easy crack.
22. V1 - To an obvious ledge.
23. V5 - Wall via undercut. *
24. V4 - Low level traverse.
25. V2 - Traverse the lip.
26. V3 - Long traverse
27. V5 - **The Full Monte** Link p24, p25 and p26 together. *
